Former DEA agent is accused of helping the CJNG launder millions of dollars and facilitate military-grade weapons.

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A former high-level DEA agent and an associate have been charged with conspiracy to launder millions of dollars and to obtain military-grade firearms and explosives for a Mexican drug cartel, according to an indictment unsealed Friday in New York City.

Paul Campo, 61, of Oakton, Virginia, who retired from the DEA in 2016 after a 25-year career, and Robert Sensi, 75, of Boca Raton, Florida, were allegedly caught in an undercover operation involving their dealings with a confidential source posing as a member of the Jalisco New Generation Cartel, but who was in fact being directed by law enforcement officials.
